Ebun JOSEPH was born in 1970 to Nigerian parents. She earned in her home country a degree in microbiology from the University of Benin. Still while based in Lagos, she served as administrative secretary for the British Association of Nigeria, before moving to Ireland in 2002. Upon her arrival, she played an active role in the Nigerian community of her country of adoption. Her field work has opened up a new field of possibilities that she has sanctioned with various degrees. Firstly, a Master in Adult Guidance and Counseling from the Maynooth University in 2010. She defended the following year a thesis on Beyond Integration: An inquiry into the lived experience of immigrants in Ireland. Her research on the topic is endless. In 2015, she became a doctor in philosophy, justice and social equality, with racial stratification of the Irish labor market as research topic. Passionate about writing, Ebun joined the teams of the African Voice Newspaper in 2010 where she worked as a columnist. That very same year, she founded The Unforgettable Womens Network (TUWN). An organisation which advocates for the equal valuing of the female person in public and private sphere of life. Author, she published in 2012: *Becoming Unforgettable. Uncovering the Essence of the Woman*. A motivational book for these women who are lost and are in need of encouragement. She also published in 2015 *Trapped: Prison without Walls*.

This fiction depicts the life of this woman locked in a violent marriage and her native traditions. Since 2012, Ebun has been involved in research on the issue of the impact of race on the labor market. A focus on immigrants with Spanish, Polish and Nigerian origins. In addition, she has been an academic tutor at University College Dublin since 2014. Since 2017, she has been a career counselor at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland. ♀
